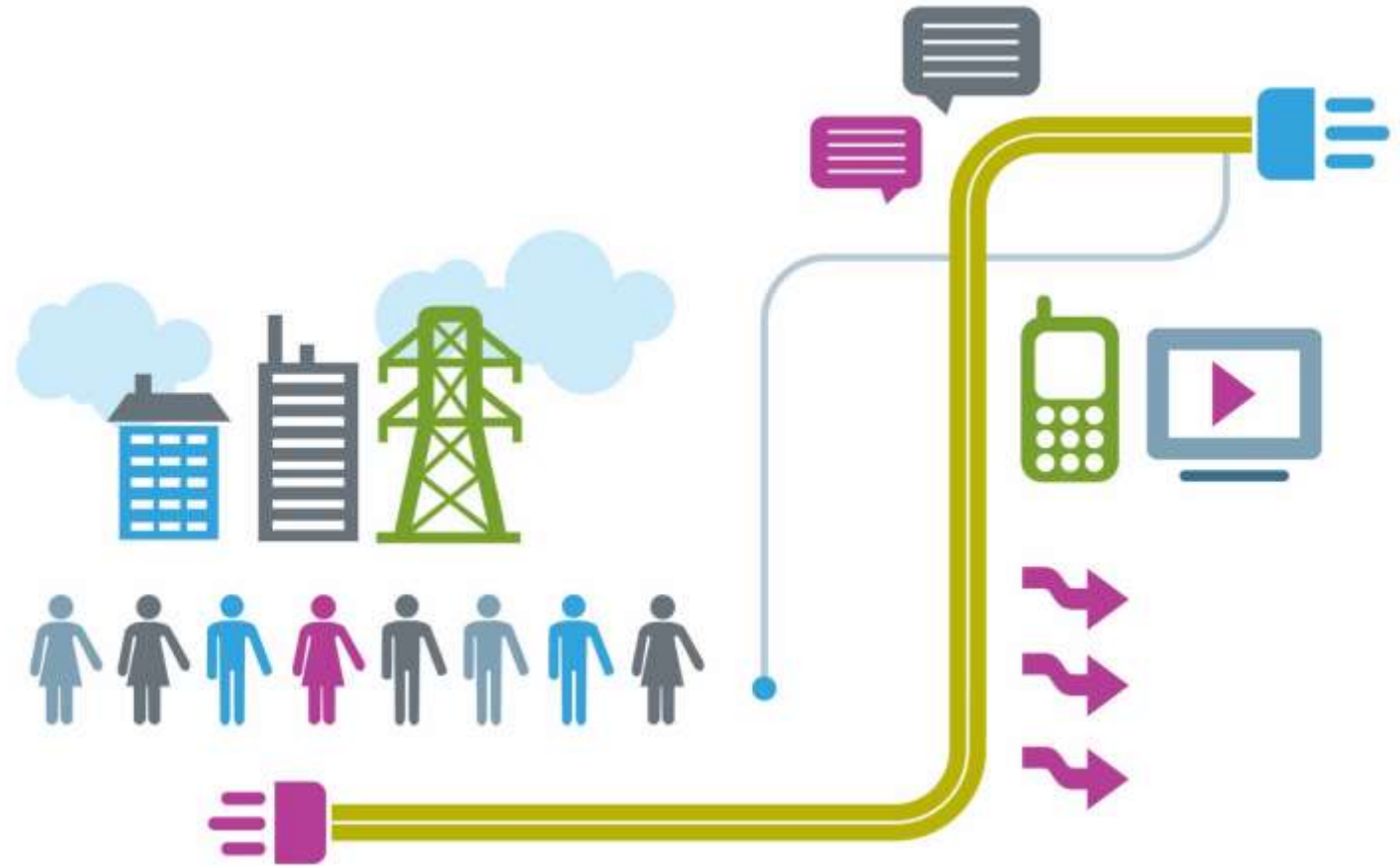

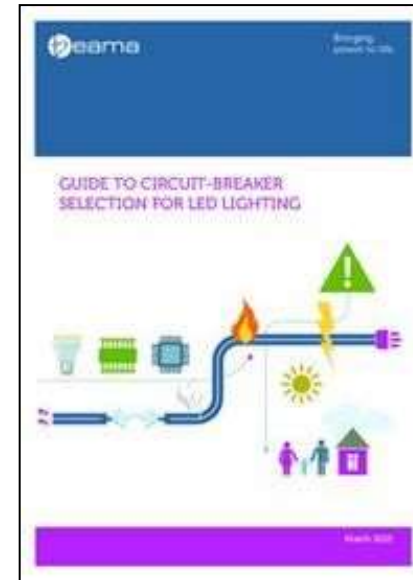

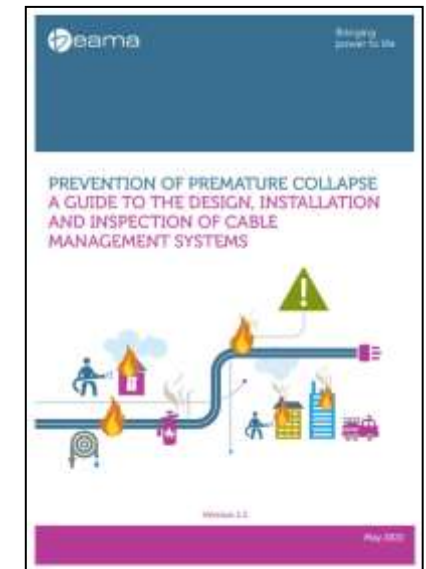

# UKCA Marking

- UKCA is the new marking system in GB, replacing CE marking
- Live from 1 Jan 2021, mandatory from 1 Jan 2023
- Temporary arrangements for CE-marked goods in GB
- Many regulated products affected – those previously CE marked
- Responsibilities on manufacturers, importers, distributors and wholesalers
- Manufacturers have been converting to UKCA
- Own brand and imported products – requirements apply
- Special arrangements for Northern Ireland (CE and UKNI marks)
