The LIA's Guide to the latest announcement on RoHS

The EU published its review of RoHS exemptions on mercury containing lamps on 24th February 2022 in the Official Journal of the European Union. Post Brexit, our industry awaited confirmation of the UK timetable, on Monday 30th January 2023, DEFRA published the Secretary of State's determination applicable to England, Scotland and Wales on the Government's website. The lamp type exemptions mirror the EU, but with extended implementation timescales as listed below.






Results of the EDA's Manufacturer Surveys



Wholesalers: Comparing turnover in Q1 2023 with Q1 2022










Inflation at 10.1% in March 2023
